

I'd like to thank everyone who took the time to fill in my recent annual survey. Over 1,600 residents of the electorate of Cowper provided answers and feedback. Results to the multiple choice questions can be found within this report.

SURVEY FAQs

How was the survey conducted?

The survey was available online and accessed via www.patconaghan.com.au

How long was it live to the public?

The survey went live on March 27 at 10am until May 21 at 10pm.

Where was it advertised?

Advertising for the survey began on March 27 across the following media avenues:

Local Press Ads

Adverts with QR codes linking directly to the survey were published across the 8 week period in FOCUS magazine (Coffs Harbour & Port Macquarie editions), Macleay Argus, Port News and News of the Area (Coffs Harbour & Nambucca editions).

Local Radio Ads

30 second radio ads were run across Triple M in Coffs Harbour and Port Macquarie (the reach of these stations covering the entire Cowper electorate)

Social Media

Boosted ads were Geotargeted across Instagram and Facebook

Email Blast

Email sent to all subscribers to Pat's newsletter

Mailbox Delivery

Call to complete the survey was included in the April Newsletter that was delivered to every mailbox of every home around the electorate on the 24th of April

Why were some personal details required?

In order to ensure that responses were limited to residents within the electorate, details were required for verification purposes only.

This also meant that an individual respondent could not answer the survey multiple times and impact the results in any way.






To the question 'Please number (from 1 to 4) the four issues that concern you most', these were the top 5 issues as voted by survey respondents.




It should be noted that Housing Affordability was the number 1 issue in the open ended questions featured later in the survey.













Which of the following do you believe is the best way the Government can support a strong economy and jobs? Answered: 1,474 Skipped: 162


How concerned are you at Australia's level of deficit and debt?

How concerned are you that the Labor Government's Industrial Relations policies might give too much power to unions?







Do you think there should be a "back to basics" approach in schools, with more focus on numeracy and literacy?



What do you think of Australia's commitment to reduce carbon emissions by 43% by 2030:



Which of the following priorities do you think is the MOST important for Australia's energy system:




